Sangiovese

Italy's international chosen one. Grown in many regions of Tuscany and showing different characteristics from each – much like a child reared by different parents in different places. Some things stay the same, some things are “tweaked” a bit. Chianti is the most famous. Brunello di Montalcino is the most revered. International blends with Sangiovese, Cabernet Sauvignon, and other bold grapes are grouped into a category known as “Super Tuscans”, Cabernet Sauvignon serves as the foundation of most of these wines. They are completed and improved by blending Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Malbec, and sometimes Petit Verdot or Syrah. These wines are the most beloved “children” of their wineries. The Sangiovese grape is rich with flavor, possesses strong acidity making it a terrific food wine, and some have serious structure and intensity.
